Reading: Read 20 minutes per day.

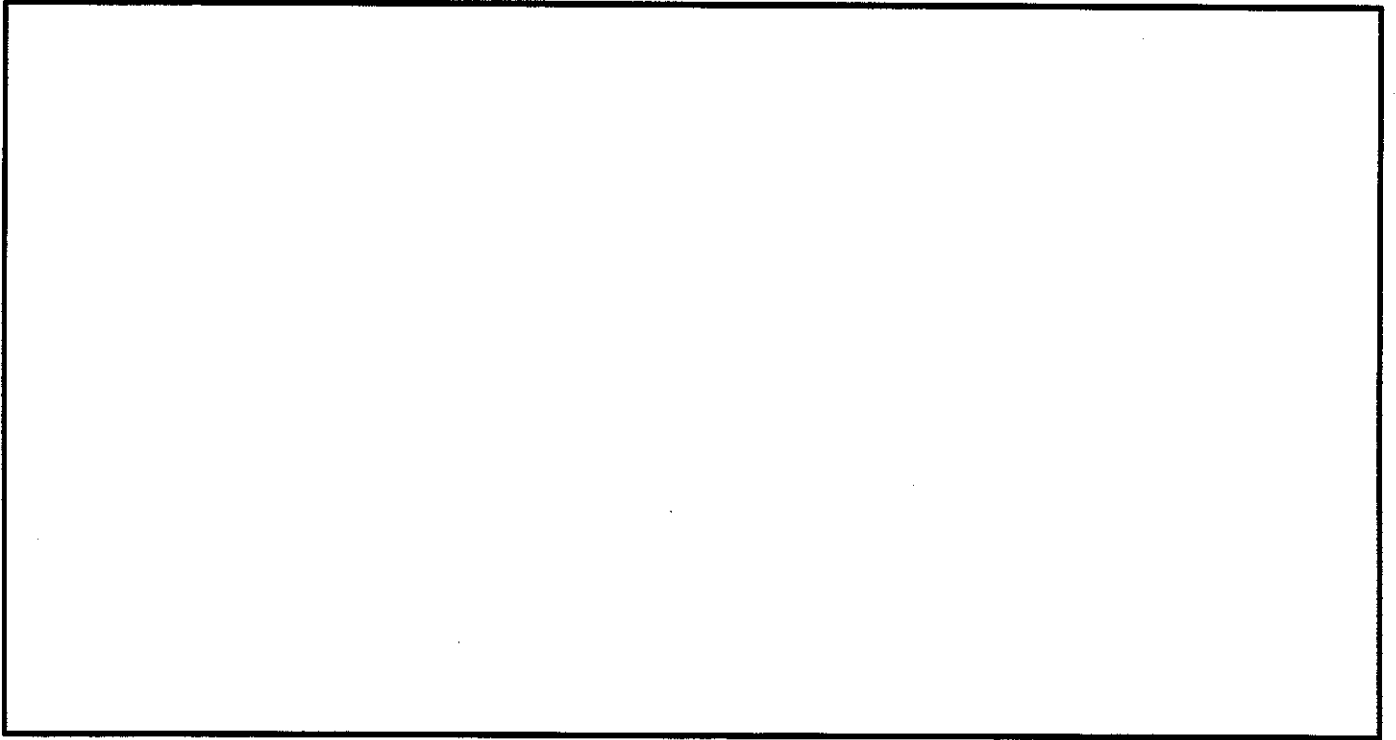
Journal Writing: Write in your journal at least once a week on a story you read that week.
