Please find below the summer assignments for your child's grade level:

Rising Third Grade:

Reading: Read 20 minutes per day.

Journal Writing: Write at least once a week about a story that you read that week. Each entry should include the date, book title, author, and at least 4-5 sentences summarizing what you read.


Math: *Proficiency of addition and subtraction facts.*

Practice your addition and subtraction facts and multiplication facts. If you do not have a set of multiplication flashcards, please purchase them and study your multiplication facts as often as possible. Your summer packet includes a set of addition and subtraction math challenges. Have a parent keep time for each test working towards 100% accuracy in the 5 minute time limit.


